ARTS, CULTURE, & HERITAGE

FORT JEMSEG

This national historic site was built as a trading post in 1659 by Thomas Temple during the English possession of Acadia.

QUEENS COUNTY HERITAGE MUSEUM

Immerse yourself in the history of province with stories, artifacts and exhibitions from Indigenous, Acadians, Loyalists, the European migration, Confederation, the Great Depression, and the World Wars. Visit historical sites such as the Tilley House, the Loomcrofters Studio, the Court House, and the Flower House.

ACACIA GALLERY

Explore over 40 sizeable pieces of artwork by Richard Flynn while enjoying the cathedral skylights and contemporary setting of the second Acacia Gallery built in 1977 by David Kantor.

OUTDOOR LIFESTYLE

GAGETOWN FARMERS MARKET

Find a vibrant mix of local artisans, farmers, craftspeople, and other vendors at the weekly Gagetown Farmer's Market every summer.

THE PINES CONSERVATION PARK

With 1.3km of trail systems, this park is the perfect place to explore the beauty of Cambridge Narrows while hiking, biking, or camping.

THE ROBINSON TRAIL

A 3.4km loop near Cambridge Narrows that is great for hiking and mountain biking.

DID YOU KNOW?

Arcadia is home to one of New Brunswick's greatest mysteries. This large mansion known as The Mount House can be found on an island near Gagetown. It is thought to be more than 350 years old - possibly one of the oldest substantial dwellings in the Maritimes and can be explored by boat.
